Research reveals students who had some type of Post Secondary Education experience were much more likely to obtain competitive employment, required fewer supports and earned higher wages.



Social Skills: Social skills are an important part of independent life. We will work on real-life scenarios and relationship development in a variety of settings.


Career Development: Individualized instruction to help prepare for the workforce which will include communication skills, resume building, mock job interviews and career exploration.
